MINUTES OF 17<sup>th</sup> PROJECT STEERING COMMITTEE (PSC) MEETING OF NATIONAL CYCLONE RISK MITIGATION PROJECT (NCRMP) PHASE-I HELD AT NDMA BHAWAN, NEW DELHI ON 19<sup>th</sup> JANUARY, 2018.

The 17<sup>th</sup> Project Steering Committee (PSC) meeting of NCRMP (Phase-I) was held on 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2018 at NDMA Bhawan, New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Sh. R.K. Jain, Member, NDMA. List of officers present in the meeting is enclosed at Annexure-A.

A warm welcome was extended to all the participants including Phase-I & Phase-II States. This was followed by Opening remarks from the Chair who appreciated the enthusiasm and interest shown by all the participants in taking this Project ahead. Additional Secretary & Project Director, NDMA gave a detailed agenda-wise presentation on the progress of the Project. On the basis of the discussions, the decisions arrived at in the meeting are as follows:

### Agenda Item (I): Financial Management:

**Observation:** 90% of the total outlay has been released. 86% of expenditure incurred out of the total released fund. An unspent balance of Rs.245.75 Crores is available with Andhra Pradesh & an unspent balance of Rs.82.21 Crores is available with Odisha.

#### Decision:

(i) SPIU,Andhra Pradesh committed to send the Utilization Certificate (UC) for Component-A by Feb. 2018, so that the balance fund under the Component can be released during FY 2017-18.

(ii) SPIU,Odisha agreed to provide required additional UC for Rs 41.20 Cr by 15 Feb 2018 for further release of Rs 33 Cr (approx)(Comp. B) during 2017-18.

(iii) Both AP & Odisha are required to augment the monthly average expenditure substantially to achieve the target before closure of the project.

(iv) SPIU,AP proposed to utilise saving under Phase-I to meet excess under Additional Financing. Since Revised cost sanction issued by GOI dated 09.05.2017 includes both Ph I and Additional Financing in a consolidated manner, States may utilise saving ( if any) under Ph I to meet excess cost under Addl. Financing subject to restricting total cost ( component wise) within sanctioned outlay. States should provide details of such saving ( under Ph I) and corresponding utilisation ( under Addl. Financing) to PMU, NDMA in advance.

## Agenda Item (II): Implementation of Component-A (Early Warning Dissemination System) "Last Mile Connectivity":

The Contract for supply/installation of EWDS equipment awarded to M/s. Larsen & Toubro by both States (AP& Odisha). TCIL is Knowledge Partner and TPQA Agency. Implementation Status is as under:

(a) Andhra Pradesh: Coverage in 09 Coastal Districts (Srikakulam, Vijayanagaram, Visakhapatnam, East Godavari, West Godavari, Krishna, Guntur, Prakasam & Nellore). Out of total 257 sites, 33 sites(as per L&T) are yet to be handed over to L&T. Licence for Sat-phones, Digital Mobile Radio(DMR) & Alert Sirens are to be obtained from Department of Telecommunications(DoT). Bandwidth for interconnecting State Emergency Operation Centre(SEOC) /District Emergency Operation Centre(DEOC)/Mandal Emergency Operation Centre (MEOC) not available from AP State Wide Area Network (APSWAN).

#### Decision:

- (i) Although SPIU,AP informed that only 15 sites are pending for finalization, L&T informed that 33 sites are yet to be handed over to them for implementation of EWDS. All site issues to be resolved before 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2018 and AP to provide list of sites already handed over to L&T to PMU, NDMA within a week (latest by 30 Jan, 2018).
- (ii) The Supplementary Agreement with L&T for variation to be concluded by AP at the earliest.
- (iii) SPIU/L&T shall ensure installation, testing and commissioning of EWDS in all sites already handed over to them by March, 2018.
- (iv) L&T confirmed to issue work order to BSNL to provide required bandwidth by 22.01.2018.
- (v) SPIU to expedite procurement of requisite licences from DoT at the earliest, but latest by 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2018.
- (b) Odisha: Coverage in 06 Coastal Districts (Puri, Ganjam, Bhadrak, Jagatsinghpur, Kendrapara and Balasore). All sites (161) made available for installation. It is noted that installation of available equipment is almost over. Licence for DMR, Satellite Phone & Alert Siren received, but Import Licence for DMR yet to be received. TPQA Report submitted by TCIL. Functional testing of equipment to be done by L&T. Location Based Alert System (LBAS) yet to be provided by L&T.

#### Decision:

- (i) All physical installations to be completed by end of January, 2018 and to be commissioned by March, 2018.
- (ii) SPIU, Odisha informed that Import License for DMR is likely to be received shortly.
- (iii) TCIL has given their comments on LBAS solution proposed by L&T. It was decided that TCIL/L&T shall resolve LBAS related issue in consultation with DoT within a week, latest by 30 Jan, 2018.

Agenda Item No (IV): Implementation Status of various studies under Component-C:

## (a) Hazard Risk and Vulnerability Assessment study by M/s. RMSI for 13 Coastal States / UTs:

The Study was completed and all deliverables are approved. The Web-Composite Risk Atlas(CRA) has since been migrated to NIC Server. The User Id & Password shared with all coastal States. All 13 coastal States/UTs are requested by PMU,NDMA to ensure that the Web-CRA is used extensively as a tool for effective disaster management and risk mitigation activities including updation of data at frequent intervals. States to send periodic reports on the usage of Web-CRA to PMU,NDMA.

#### (b) Post Disaster Need Assessment study by NIDM:

The Study stands completed in January, 2017 and Reports in respect of all 12 Deliverables submitted to MHA for taking it forward.

#### (c) Benefit Monitoring & Evaluation(BME):

Study undertaken by M/s. GfK, Knowledge Partner. Mid-Term Evaluation completed and Report submitted. End-Term Evaluation underway and expected to be completed by March, 2018.

## Agenda Item (V): Position of Handing Over of MPCS to MPCS Maintenance and Management Committees:

Andhra Pradesh: Handed over 141 out of 196 completed Cyclone Shelters to the Management Committees and Corpus Fund for 138 MPCS released @ Rs.5 lakh each.

**Odisha**: Handed over 266 out of 281 completed Cyclone Shelters to the Managing Committees and released Corpus Fund @ Rs.5 lakh each for 316 Cyclone Shelters.

#### Decision:

SPIUs to expedite handing over of completed Cyclone Shelters along with release of Corpus Fund by Feb 2018 end.

#### (a) Status of Training under Component-C by States:

**Andhra Pradesh**: Conducted 219 Training programmes to train 10173 volunteers through Red Cross.

**Odisha**: Conducted Basic Orientation Training for 309 MPCS (61,800 coastal population), but yet to conduct the first round of 11 days Training Programme.

#### **Decision:**

Both AP & Odisha shall ensure that all relevant trainings are imparted before 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2018.

#### Agenda Item (VI):Status of External Audit:

(i) Audit Report for FY 2016-17 awaited from Odisha. Reports for PMU,NDMA, NIDM & AP received/ shared with World Bank.

#### **Decision:**

(i) Odisha to submit the Audit Report by 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2018.

#### Agenda Item (VII): Procurement of Shelter Level Equipment by Odisha:

It was informed that Procurement related Purchase Committee has been constituted by the Governing Body OSDMA.

#### **Decision:**

(i) SPIU/ OSDMA will ensure procurement and supply of shelter level equipment by 31<sup>st</sup> march, 2018.

#### Agenda Item (IX): Other Items

 Providing Lightening Arrestors at all MPCSs: SPIU Odisha raised the Issue of necessity to provide Lightning Arrestors at all MPCS. It was decided that both AP & Odisha will arrange for providing the same as per the requirement of National Building Code. The expenses will be met from the savings available under component B (if any) or through State's funds. The procurement and installation in this regard will be completed by 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2018.
