MINUTES OF 14<sup>th</sup> PROJECT STEERING COMMITTEE (PSC) MEETING OF NATIONAL CYCLONE RISK MITIGATION PROJECT (NCRMP) PHASE-II HELD AT NDMA BHAWAN, NEW DELHI ON 31<sup>st</sup> JULY, 2019.

The 14<sup>th</sup> Project Steering Committee (PSC) meeting of NCRMP (Phase-II) was held on 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2019 under the Chairmanship Sh. G. V. V. Sarma, Member Secretary, NDMA. List of officers present in the meeting is enclosed at Annexure-A.

2. A warm welcome was extended by the Chairman to all participants followed by a presentation on status of implementation of project by SPIUs. On the basis of the presentations by the SPIUs and discussions, the decisions arrived at the meeting are as follows:

Agenda I: Award of Early Warning Dissemination System (EWDS) Works:
