PROCEEDINGS OF PROJECT STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING OF NATIONAL CYCLONE RISK MITIGATION PROJECT (NCRMP) PHASE-II FOR QUARTER ENDING 31st MARCH, 2017 HELD AT PURI, ODISHA.

The Project Steering Committee (PSC) meeting of NCRMP (Phase-II) for the quarter ending 31st March, 2017 was held on 3rd May, 2017 at Puri, Odisha under the Chairmanship of Sh. R.K. Jain, Member, NDMA. List of officers present in the meeting is enclosed at Annexure-A.

- 2. Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA) organised a visit to Multi Purpose Cyclone Shelter (MPCS), Saline Embankment and Early Warning Dissemination System (EWDS) site in the district of Puri, Odisha on 2nd May, 2017 as a prelude to the PSC meeting. The visit was led by Member, NDMA (Sh. R.K.Jain) in which Principal Secretaries/Project Directors/Project Managers along with line-department officials from Phase-I & Phase-II States participated. The Multi-purpose Cyclone Shelter (MPCS) built at Chupuringi village, Puri District was officially handed over to Cyclone Shelter Management & Maintenance Committee (CSMMC) during the visit and interaction with the community was held, followed by a Mock-Drill by the Search & Rescue Team formed under the CSMMC. Subsequently the team visited Keutajanga Saline Embankment and also witnessed Flood Rescue Skill demonstration by Odisha Disaster Rapid Action Force (ODRAF) jawans at Chandrabaga. The work site of Early Warning Dissemination System at Khlakatapatana village was also visited followed by community interaction / meeting. These visits provided ample information, orientation to Phase-II States about the utility and benefit extended to the coastal community through infrastructure constructed under the Project. Interaction with the linedepartment staff of Odisha with their counter-part participants from Phase-II States was effective.
- 3. At the outset, MD,OSDMA extended a warm welcome to the participants from Phase-I & Phase-II States wherein he shared the experiences regarding how Odisha recovered from major disaster over the years and developed strategy / specialisation in tackling some of the worst cyclones, floods, drought etc. This was followed by Opening remarks from the Chair who appreciated the enthusiasm and interest shown by all the participants in taking this Project ahead. Project Director, PMU, NCRMP, NDMA gave a detailed agenda-wise presentation on the progress of the Project. On the basis of the discussions, the decisions arrived at in the meeting are as follows:

3(a) Status of filling up of various posts in the project by States or engagement of a Project Management Consultant (PMC):

All the States informed that they have engaged the required staff or PMC except Goa. Goa expressed difficulty in getting staff through advertisement/deputation, but ensured to fill all the vacancies at the earliest.

3(b) Status of implementation of Component-A (Early Warning Dissemination System-EWDS) – Last Mile Connectivity :

Goa : SPIU, Goa has engaged M/s. TCIL as Knowledge Partner for implementation of EWDS.

Gujarat: State Plans to engage Gujarat Info Petro Ltd (GIPL) through State fund. GSDMA has submitted Draft RFP to NDMA recently which is under review.

Karnataka: ToR approved by NDMA and World Bank for engaging M/s. TCIL as Knowledge Partner. Shortly to be uploaded in the STEP for single source selection.

Kerala: SPIU, Kerala has decided to engage M/s. TCIL as Knowledge Partner .Necessary ToR, Techno-Commercial proposal with Single source justification awaited from State.

Maharashtra: SPIU, Maharashtra to engage M/s. TCIL as Knowledge Partner. Techno-Commercial proposal submitted by M/s.TCIL is under process by the State.

West Bengal: ToR for engagement of Knowledge Partner approved by Word Bank and NDMA is under process. Eol floated by SPIU and short listing under process.

All the States were requested to expedite implementation of Component A –EWDS. TCIL was directed to upgrade and update its technology option in line with developments in the technology. It was agreed that experts would be deployed area-wise in the States and customised as per requirements.

It was agreed that the issue raised by Gujarat regarding alternate Technology will be discussed in detail in consultation with M/s.TCIL.

It was observed that Gujarat (Rs 67.4 Cr.), West Bengal (Rs. 80.91 Cr.) and all other States are having unspent fund available with them . All states were requested to utilise unspent fund at an early date to enable further fund release in F.Y. 2017-18.

Utilization of Budget up to 31.03.2017 including status of (i) submission of Utilization Certificates by the State :

IUFR received from all States.

(ii) Review of Budget for 2017-18 and Procurement Plan :

The Budget projection received from all States was reviewed. Gujarat and Maharashtra were asked to rationalise their Budget for 2017-18.

3(e) Component – C:

(i) Scope of Component-C and methodology to be adopted for initiating Studies.

ToR for Multi-Hazard Risk Assessment study stood approved by World Bank and is shortly to be uploaded in STEP platform and subsequently Eol shall be floated by PMU, NDMA.

(ii) Shelter Level Training under Component-C :

PMU,NDMA has received Shelter Level Training Plans and Budget from 05 NCRMP States except West Bengal. After its review, States were asked to re-submit incorporating missing vital aspects and after necessary rationalisation as conveyed by PMU. All Phase-II States shall contact the Social Management Specialist in PMU, NDMA for any assistance / guidance for preparing their Training Plan and Budget.

(iii) Training for Capacity Building:

Seven(07) Training for Trainers (ToT) modules were developed under the study of "Preparation of Long Term Training & Capacity Building" conducted during Phase-I of NCRMP. An Operational Plan was chalked out for implementing these modules / deliverables in Phase-II of the Project. As a first step towards this, National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM) conducted 05 National Level Training for Master Trainers / ToT covering five priority sectors of Health, Education, Rural Development, Panchayati Raj Institutions and Urban Local Bodies during the months of January — March, 2017. The next step of implementing at the State / District level needs to be based on feedback received from Master Trainers trained at the National Level by NIDM.

NIDM in association with PMU, NDMA shall take all necessary action in rolling out the Operational Plan of Capacity building. All NCRMP Phase-I & Phase-II States shall identify nodal Institutes / Organisation for imparting Training and submit Training Plan & Budget up to District level at the earliest.

3(f) Status of External Audit for Financial Year 2015-16 and submission of Report to World Bank by December, 2016:

External Audit Report for the Financial Year 2015-16 submitted by all the Phase-II States. Compliance Report on Audit observations awaited from States.

3(g) Any other item with the permission of the Chair :

Director DM (MHA) informed all States about forthcoming National Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction (NPDRR), 2017 scheduled on 15th &16th May 2017 at Vigyan Bhawan ,New Delhi and requested all States for participation to make it a success.

The Chair thanked MD,OSDMA, Odisha and their staff for the successful field visit, arrangement and conduct of the meeting and for the hospitality extended.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
