MINUTES OF 21<sup>ST</sup> PROJECT STEERING COMMITTEE (PSC) MEETING OF NATIONAL CYCLONE RISK MINITGATION PROJECT (NCRMP) PHASE-II HELD THROUGH VIDEO CONFERENCING WITH STATES/SPIUS AT NDMA BHAWAN, NEW DELHI ON 26<sup>TH</sup> MARCH, 2021 AT 11:00 AM.

The 21<sup>st</sup> Project Steering Committee (PSC) meeting of NCRMP (Phase-II) was held on 26<sup>th</sup> March, 2021 at 11 AM under the Chairmanship of Sh. Sanjeeva Kumar, Member Secretary, NDMA. List of participants in the meeting is enclosed at Annexure – A.

- 2. A warm welcome was extended by the Chairman to all participants followed by a presentation on status of implementation of project by the SPIUs through VC. During the meeting the following were highlighted:
  - i) Most of the State Governments were not appropriately represented. Since, the meeting was being chaired by Member Secretary, NDMA, i.e. Secretary to Government of India, the representation from State Governments should have been at appropriate level. It will be appreciated if along with the Project Manager of the State PIU, in such meeting Principal Secretary/Secretary of the Departments concerned in the State also participates to make such meetings more useful.
  - ii) It was observed that there was lack of coordination between the Departments of the State Govt. and the State PIU. It was expected that the State Governments should have sorted out their in-house issues/communications before attending the meeting with GoI.
  - iii) The State Governments should appreciate the fact that this project is being implemented through a loan taken by GoI from WB, which has to be repaid. Any lapse in achieving the physical and financial targets may restrict flow of funds and have an adverse bearing on any such future projects.
  - iv) The progress of implementation in Goa was noted as very poor and it was also observed that there was serious lack of coordination between the State PIU and the Departments concerned of the State Govt.
  - v) All states were advised to adopt PFMS as mandated by GoI for receipt and disbursement of funds. FA NDMA to issue detailed advisory to the States on the procedure in consultation with CCA(H), MHA.


#### **Agenda VII: Additional Financing**

#### Miscellaneous:-

- A PERT Chart with specific milestones for all activities under the project to be prepared by all SPIUs for better monitoring and implementation. Updated PERT Chart must be shared with PMU by 30<sup>th</sup>April 2021.
- After revision of the NCRMP-II outlay, no additional fund is available. Hence, GSDMA to re-jig the existing revised outlay (within the authorized outlay) at their end and submit the re-jigged proposal to PMU/NDMA for review (ref. PMU letter dated 18<sup>th</sup> March 2021).
- SPIUs must attend meeting with PMU by calling officials from all of their line-departments.
- SPIU Maharashtra to rationalize their requirement of manpower etc. so that they don't exceed the expenditure as authorized in the revised outlay.
- Environmental Screening report w.r.t. execution of EWDS works in Goa, Karnataka & Kerala to be submitted by respective SPIU by 30<sup>th</sup> April 2021.
- EMP compliance report for all ongoing projects to be submitted on quarterly basis by SPIUs.

- EMP Closure Report of completed projects to be submitted by SPIUs 30<sup>th</sup> April 2021.
- All Environmental & Social documents i.e. EIAs, SIAs, RAPs, Env. & Soc. Screening reports etc. to be disclosed by SPIUs on their official website. Confirmation in this regard to be given by all SPIUs by 15<sup>th</sup> April 2021.
- M/s AMS, the consultant for Benefit Monitoring & Evaluation Study needs few DPRs from each SPIUs to prepare their report. All SPIUs to share DPRs with the consultant on priority.
